Notes to the Accounts

- 1 In 2017, WfC Ireland partnered with Covenant World Relief, Rotary Canada and a private funder, for 3 specific projects.
- 2 Our partner Water For Cameroon Ngoketunjia (WFCN) uses the monies sent by WFC Ireland for well-digging, filter purchase, and local Health Promoters costs.
 The amount on the expenditure page for well-digging shows the amount spent directly by WFC Ireland and does not include the expenditure by WFCN.
- 3 WfC Ireland covered the travel, accommodation and project expenses in Cameroon for the Project Manager 3 visits were made in 2016, and 2 in 2017. This figure also includes expenses of a Cameroon colleague providing training at a workshop
- 4 Rent was paid for a secure space in Ndop to store supplies. This figure also includes cost of skype phone calls between Ireland and Cameroon
- 5 Reconciliation of advances to Project Manager and expenditure incurred by him in Cameroon.
